

On the grassed area adjacent to Links Road, Bowral High Koori students were present for this historic occasion that was marked by a Welcome to Country by Aunty Val, traditional owner and elder of the Gundungurra people. There was also a smoking ceremony and address by Councillor Whipper. Following the ceremony the students joined community and guests at Wingecarribee Aboriginal Community Cultural Centre for a celebration and lunch. The project will see the installation of Locality signage for each of the Shire's 53 gazetted Localities signifying the traditional land of the Gundungurra people and the culmination of many years of work by the local Aboriginal community. ASPIRE

Our ASPIRE excursions for Years 7 to 10 have been heading out to the various universities throughout November.

Students from Year 7 visited the Campbelltown campus of Western Sydney University (4 November), Year 8 will be going to UTS Broadway campus (24 November), Year 9 visited the Australian National University in Canberra (17 November). Earlier in the year, students from Year 10 visited the Wollongong campus of the University of Wollongong (7 June) as part of UOW's In2Uni program.

Students are always excitedly discussing possible university pathways on the way home after each excursion.


